

ORDINANCE NO. 126

AN ORDINANCE, amending the 1955 Budget Ordinance No. 70, as amended by Ordinance No. 120, by decreasing certain unexpended items, making transfers between general classes of funds and between items within classes.

WHEREAS, Section 5 of Chapter 158 of the Laws of 1923 embodied in R. C. W. 35.33.120, was amended by Chapter 322 of the Laws of 1955 to permit the City Council to readjust the municipal budget by making transfers of appropriated but unexpended funds from one general class to another class of appropriations and to permit transfer of unexpended funds for specific items to other items so that the same may be more advantageously expended to the best interests of the city; Now, Therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council does hereby find that those funds heretofore appropriated in Ordinance No. 70 and as readjusted by Ordinance No. 120, for the several classes and items listed below are not required for the city's operation in 1955 to the extent by which said funds and items are decreased in Section 4 below, and that the classes and items listed in Section 5 below require more funds for expenditure in 1955 than had been anticipated or were available in making appropriations in Ordinance No. 70, as amended by Ordinance No. 120, and that it is to the best interests of the municipality to transfer funds appropriated in Ordinance No. 70, as amended, so that the funds so transferred and re-appropriated herein can be more advantageously expended in the rendition of municipal services in the year 1955.

Section 2. No portion of the funds so transferred shall be used to increase the salary of any employee above that provided for in Ordinance No. 70, and such transfer and re-appropriation of funds herein will not constitute an increase or decrease of the entire budget of expenditures estimated and appropriated for the year 1955 by Ordinance No. 70.

Section 3. Ordinance No. 70, passed by the City Council of the City of Bellevue, on the 7th day of October, 1954, as readjusted by Ordinance No. 120, classifying and itemizing the estimated expenditures of municipal funds for the year 1955, be, and the same hereby is, amended, to the extent by which funds are decreased in Section 4 hereof and to the extent that transfers of funds are made between classes and items of expenditures as contained in Section 5 hereof.

Section 4. Subject to the existence of unexpended funds in each of the below listed items, the appropriations for such items, as contained in Ordinance No. 70 and as amended by Ordinance No. 120, are recalled, revoked and decreased to the following extent.
