

ORDINANCE NO. 161

AN ORDINANCE, determining the public advantage in vacating a dedicated walkway in Block 2, Bellevue Industrial Court Addition.

WHEREAS, a petition was filed with the City Council to vacate a portion of Block 2, Bellevue Industrial Court Addition, below described, by owners of more than two-thirds (2/3rds) of the private property abutting the same; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council, by resolution, fixed the time for hearing said petition and gave notice thereof by posting in the manner required by law, and

WHEREAS, investigation was made as to the use of said walkway, if developed, and as to the public interest to be served or damaged by the lack of development or vacation thereof, and

WHEREAS, a hearing was had upon the petition on the 22nd day of May, 1956, at the time and place fixed in said resolution and notice, and as a result thereof the City Council having found that there is no present public need or use for such walkway and the future public need or use is not sufficient to warrant or justify the expense of improvement or maintenance of the same for public use, and that the vacation thereof would be to the public interest.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That certain walkway having a width of approximately 6 feet, running in an east-west direction in Block 2 of Bellevue Industrial Court Addition, according to the Plat thereof in Volume 42 of Plats, Page 9, records of King County, between 106th Avenue Northeast and 105th Avenue Northeast, is vacated.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and legal publication.
