

ORDINANCE NO. 172

AN ORDINANCE, declaring a public emergency, stating the factors constituting and estimating the amount required to meet the same and appropriating funds therefor.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE DO ORDAIN
AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There hereby is declared to exist a public emergency which could not have been foreseen reasonably at the time of making estimates for the annual budget and which requires the expenditure of money not provided for in the annual budget for the year 1956, which emergency is not one of those specifically mentioned in Section 32, Chapter 337, Laws of 1955.

Section 2. The City Council finds the following facts to constitute such emergency, to-wit: The unexpected breakdown of the city's road grading equipment to such point as to make repair and restoration thereof economically unfeasible, together with the severe deterioration of the surface of the city streets requiring the immediate acquisition of new and more efficient road grading equipment. That funds for such acquisition have been provided by bonds issued pursuant to Ordinance No. 164 and that extremely favorable bids have been furnished and accepted pursuant to publication of call for bids as required by law.

Section 3. The estimated amount required to cover the cost of acquisition of the lowest and best bid, together with the cost of issuing General Obligation Bonds therefor, including all incidental expenses thereof, is \$13,500.00.

Section 4. That there be and hereby are allowed, established and appropriated the following total sums for the expenditure of the above described emergency purposes in each of the following classifications, to-wit:

Section 5. A copy of the emergency appropriation as hereby adopted shall be transmitted to the office of the Auditor of the State of Washington, Division of Municipal Corporations.

Section 6. This ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and operation of governmental functions and shall take effect immediately upon its passage, approval and publication.
