ORDINANCE NO. 191

AN ORDINANCE Relating to budget, declaring and stating the facts constituting an emergency and estimating the amount required to meet the same and appropriating funds therefor.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There is declared to exist a public emergency which could not have been foreseen reasonably at the time of making the estimates of the annual budget for the year 1957 for the City of Bellevue and which requires the general expenditure of money not provided for in such budget and which emergency is not one of those specifically mentioned in Section 32, Chapter 337, Laws of 1955.

Sec. 2. The facts found by the City Council to constitute such emergency are as follows:

The necessity for moving the public library from the community club to larger quarters at a rent reserved of Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) per month and the necessity for paying King County Library District the sum of Three Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-Three and 40/100 Dollars (\$3,663.40) more than was levied or anticipated to be required in appropriating funds therefor at the time of adopting the 1957 budget and certifying the taxes to be levied therefor.

Sec. 3. The estimated net cost of servicing the contract with King County Library and renting adequate space therefor is Four Thousand Four Hundred Thirteen and 40/100 Dollars (\$4, 413.40).

Sec. 4. There is allowed, established and appropriated hereby the additional sum of Four Thousand Four Hundred Thirteen and 40/100 Dollars (\$4,413.40) for use in the maintenance and operation of the public library.

Sec. 5. All expenditures made hereunder shall be paid for by the issuance of emergency warrants, which warrants shall be paid from any monies on hand in the City Treasury in the Current Expense Fund or may be registered and bear interest and be called in the manner and under the circumstances authorized by law. The Clerk shall include in the annual budget to be submitted to the Council the total amount of emergency warrants issued hereunder excepting an appropriate surplus out of which the emergency warrants were paid, if any.

Sec. 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and publication in the manner provided by law.
