

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 2164

AN ORDINANCE relating to the 1974 budget; Appropriating funds received in excess of estimated revenues; and appropriating funds by emergency; stating the facts constituting an emergency and estimating the amount required to meet said emergency and amending Ordinance No. 1979, as amended by Ordinance No. 2064 and Ordinance No. 2163.

WHEREAS, RCW 35A.33.120 permits the Council to authorize expenditures from funds received in excess of estimated revenues by an amendment of the original budget; and, it is desirable to increase the appropriation for the funds designated through monies received in excess of estimated revenues during the current fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, there exists a public emergency which could not have been reasonably foreseen at the time of filing of the preliminary budget, which emergency requires the expenditure of money not provided for in the budget for the year 1974; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2 of the 1974 budget Ordinance No. 1979 is hereby amended by appropriating unanticipated revenues received during the current fiscal year to the funds set forth below and in the amounts set forth below, and set forth in more detail in Appendix A, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Said appropriations are for the purpose of paying for the balance of the 1974 budget year the operating costs of said funds.

Section 2. There is hereby declared to exist a public emergency which could not have been reasonably foreseen at the time of the filing of the preliminary budget for the year 1974, which emergency requires the expenditure of money not provided for in the 1974 Annual Budget, and which emergency is not one of those non-debatable emergencies specifically enumerated in RCW Section 35A.33.080.

Section 3. The facts found by the City Council to constitute such public emergency are as follows:

The currently collected revenues for the funds set forth in section 4 of this Ordinance are insufficient to support the appropriations needed for each of the said funds.

Section 4. Section 2 of the 1974 budget Ordinance No. 1979 is hereby further amended by appropriating by emergency to the funds set forth below and in the amounts set forth below, and set forth in more detail in Appendix A, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Said emergency appropriations are for the purpose of paying for the balance of the 1974 budget year the costs of said funds.


Section 5. All expenditures made hereunder shall be paid by warrants from any available money and the fund properly chargeable with such expenditures. If, at any time, there is insufficient money on hand in a fund with which to pay such warrants as presented, the warrants shall be registered, bear interest, and be called in the same manner as other registered warrants as prescribed in RCW 35A.21.110.

Section 6. A public emergency exists in the City, the circumstances of which are more particularly set forth above; which emergency requires the immediate passage of this ordinance for the preservation of public health, safety and welfare in the City, and shall take effect immediately.

Section 7. The City Clerk is directed to transmit a certified copy of this ordinance to the Auditor of the State of Washington, Division of Municipal Corporations.

First introduced on the 16th day of December, 1974, and passed by an affirmative vote of at least a majority plus one of the whole membership of the Council this 23rd day of December, 1974, and signed in authentication of its passage this 23rd day of December, 1974.


