CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON
ORDINANCE NO. 2228
AN ORDINANCE determining the public advantage in vacating the portion of J. F. Pike Road No. 2 within the City of Bellevue.

WHEREAS, the City Council did on the thirtieth day of June, 1975, pass Resolution No. 2557 fixing the time and place for a hearing to consider the petition of Don L. Kline and Environment Northwest for the vacation of a portion of J. F. Pike Road No. 2 within the City of Bellevue, said petitioners the owners of more than $2 / 3$ of the land abutting the area proposed for vacation and gave notice of said hearing by posting and mailing in the manner required by law; and

WHEREAS, investigation was made as to the use of said street and the public interest to be served or damaged by a change of use or vacation thereof; and

WHEREAS, a hearing was held upon the said petition on the 28th day of July, 1975, at the time and place fixed in said resolution and notice, and as a result thereof, the City Council having found that the vacation of said street, to the extent described in the petition, would serve the public good; and no objections thereto being made by the owners of private abutting property; now, therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:
Section 1. The following portion of J. F. Pike Road No. 2 within the City of Bellevue, to wit:

Lying within the East 460 feet of the South $1 / 2$ of the Northwest $1 / 4$ of the Southeast $1 / 4$ of Section 25, Township 25 North, Range 5 East of W.M., in King County, Washington.
is vacated.

Section 2. The administration is hereby directed to record a certified copy of this ordinance with the records department of King County.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five days after its passage, approval and legal publication.
