ORDINANCE NO. 2263

AN ORDINANCE determining the public advantage in vacating a portion of 94th Avenue S.E., between S.E. 6th and S.E. 7th in the City of Bellevue, and vacating said portion of said street.

WHEREAS, the City Council did on the 13th day of October, 1975, pass Resolution No. 2601 fixing the time and place for a hearing to consider the petition of owners of more than 2/3 of a portion of 94th Avenue S.E. between S.E. 6th and S.E. 7th within the City of Bellevue sought to be vacated, and gave notice of said hearing by posting and mailing in the manner required by law;

WHEREAS, investigation was made as to the use of said street and the public interest to be served or damaged by a change of use or vacation thereof; and

WHEREAS, a hearing was held upon the said petition on the 10th day of November, 1975 at the time and place fixed in said Resolution and notice, and as a result thereof, the City Council having found that the vacation of said street to the extent described in the petition therefor would serve the public good; and no objections thereto being made by owners of private abutting property; now therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The following portion of a street within the City of Bellevue, to-wit:

That portion of the west 40 feet of 94th Avenue S.E. adjacent to Block 10, Plat of Moorland Addition as recorded in Volume 4, Page 109, records of King County; lying south of that portion of 94th Avenue S.E. vacated by King County decree, Cause No. 403560 dated February 4, 1949; and north of the centerline extended east of Moorland Avenue as previously vacated in King County, on September 19, 1917.

is vacated; provided, however, the City reserves and establishes an easement over, under and through the above-described property, in its entirety, for the operation, maintenance, repair, reconstruction, expansion, enlargement and/or replacement of the existing three water lines, appurtenances thereto and any other existing public utilities and services.


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Section 2. The city administration is hereby directed to record a certified copy of this ordinance with the Records Department of King County.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five days after its passage, approval and legal publication.


