ORDINANCE NO. 2333

AN ORDINANCE amending Section 3 of Ordinance No. 51 and Section 9.74.030 of the Bellevue City Code, which prohibits the use of sound amplification equipment for commercial or political advertising.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 3 of Ordinance No. 51 and Section 9.14.030 of the Bellevue City Code are each hereby amended to read as follows:


9.14.030 Commercial or political advertising

No person shall operate or cause to be operated for commercial advertising or political purposes, or dissemination of propaganda, argument or information on controversial subjects, within the city, any sound amplification equipment, the sound of which is plainly audible to persons on the streets or public grounds of the city, PROVIDED THAT this section does not apply to mobile ice cream sales vehicles which utilize sound amplification equipment for music.


Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after enactment by the Council.


