

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 269

AN ORDINANCE regulating the use of fireworks; prohibiting the discharge of fireworks other than at a public display, and prohibiting the issuance of a permit therefor other than to an authorized representative of a responsible civic group; and amending Section 2 of Ordinance No. 23.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2 of Ordinance No. 23, passed by the City Council on June 23, 1953, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge, ignite, burn, or set off any fireworks within the City of Bellevue, (1) except in the course of a display for the general public of such fireworks, and (2) without having first obtained and being the holder of a valid Certificate of Fitness as a pyrotechnist, and (3) without having first obtained a valid permit therefor, from the Fire Chief or other city official duly designated by the City Manager, which permit shall be issued only to an authorized representative of a responsible civic group which shall be responsible for and conduct the public display of such fireworks."

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and legal publication.
