

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 288

AN ORDINANCE relating to traffic safety; creating a Traffic Safety Committee and prescribing its makeup and duties; and amending Section 199 of Ordinance No. 27.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There is hereby created a Traffic Safety Committee consisting of four members, and to be composed of the Mayor, or a councilman appointed by the Mayor, who shall be the chairman without vote, the Chief of Police, the City Engineer, and the Planning Director, all as ex officio members during their respective terms of office.

Section 2. The Traffic Safety Committee shall receive, study, and investigate the facts and conditions relating to complaints, suggestions, inquiries or other communications from members of the public, municipal officers, employees or other public agencies concerning the safety of the public within the City of Bellevue, including, but not limited to, traffic regulations, traffic signs and controls, regulation or use of streets and other public places, integration of building and other mechanical codes. Such committee shall report, advise, and recommend to the City Council provisions for regulatory ordinances or amendments thereto, may point out need for coordinating the activities of two or more City departments having joint or concurrent authority and duties of law enforcements under the same subject matter, and may study and recommend areas of cooperation between the City of Bellevue and other governmental agencies for the safety and health of the public.

Section 3. Section 199 of Ordinance No. 27, passed by the City Council on the 7th day of July, 1953, is hereby amended to provide as follows:

"Section 199. City Traffic Engineer.

- (a) The office of city traffic engineer is hereby established. The city traffic engineer shall be designated by the City Manager, to function as a part of the office of City Engineer, Department of Police, or Department of Streets in the exercise of the powers and duties as provided in this ordinance and in the traffic ordinances of this City.
- (b) It shall be the general duty of the city traffic engineer to install, time, and maintain traffic control devices under the supervision and direction of the Traffic Safety Committee; to conduct engineering and traffic analyses of traffic accidents, and to advise and recommend remedial measures; to conduct engineering investigation of traffic conditions and to cooperate

with other City officials in the development of the ways and means to improve traffic and safety conditions; and to perform such additional duties as may be imposed by ordinances of this City.

(c) The city traffic engineer may test traffic control devices under actual conditions of traffic."

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and legal publication.

Section 5. The bonds of said issue shall be printed or lithographed on good bond paper and shall be signed by the Mayor and attested by the Clerk of the City of Bellevue under the seal of the City and the coupons shall bear the facsimile signatures of the Mayor and the Clerk.

Section 6. Said issue of bonds shall be sold for cash at public sale for not less than par, plus accrued interest, upon sealed bids to be received at the office of the City Clerk up to the day and hour stated in the Notice of Sale hereinafter directed to be given.

Notice calling for bids to purchase said issue of bonds shall be given by publication thereof once a week for four consecutive weeks in the official newspaper of the City of Bellevue and such notice shall also be published once in the Daily Journal of Commerce of Seattle, Washington, at least ten days before the bid opening date. Such notice shall specify that bids for the purchase of said issue of bonds shall be received by the City Clerk of the City of Bellevue at the Council Chambers in the City Hall of the City on the 1stth day of April, 1959, up to 8:00 o'clock p.m., at which time all bids will be publicly opened for the purchase of said issue of bonds.

A copy of said Notice shall, at least three weeks prior to the date fixed for the sale, be mailed to the State Finance Committee, Olympia, Washington.

Bids shall be invited for the purchase of the "General Obligation Street Improvement Bonds, 1959," with fixed maturities in accordance with the schedule specified in Section 1 above.

The Notice shall specify the maximum rate of interest said issue of bonds shall bear, to-wit, 5 % per annum, and shall require bidders to submit a bid specifying as to said issue of bonds:

(a) The lowest rate or rates of interest and premium, if any, above par at which the bidder will purchase the bonds; or

(b) The lowest rate or rates of interest at which the bidder will purchase the bonds at par.

Each bid shall state the total interest cost over the life of the bonds bid for and the net effective interest rate of such bid.

Said issue of bonds shall be sold to the bidder making the best bid, subject to the right of the City Council of the City of
