ORDINANCE NO. 301

AN ORDINANCE relating to the budget; stating the facts constituting an emergency, estimating the amount required to meet the same, and appropriating funds therefor.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There is hereby declared to exist a public emergency which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of the making of the estimates for the annual budget for the year 1959 for the City of Bellevue, and which requires the expenditure of money not provided for in such annual budget and which emergency is not one of those specifically enumerated in Section 32, Chapter 337, Laws of 1955, R.C.W. 35.33.080.

Section 2. The facts found by the City Council to constitute such emergency are as follows: The existing outlet from Lake Sturtevant is by way of a pipe line of the size of 12 inch diameter; such size is inadequate, and so much so that the development in the area of Lake Sturtevant will some day cause the existing outlet to be washed out; that the permanent size of the outlet should be 36 inches in diameter; that in addition a 54 inch manhole is required at the intersection of N.E. 8th Street and 116th Avenue N.E.; that said outlet runs under N.E. 8th Street and 116th Avenue N.E.; and it is desirable that said permanent outlet be installed while it can be laid in an open cut, made possible by the existing construction by the State of the N.E. 8th Street interchange.

Section 3. The estimated cost of constructing said permanent outlet is \$2,500.00.

Section 4. There is hereby allowed, established and appropriated the sum of \$2,500.00, for use in the construction and installation of said permanent outlet, said sum to be appropriated to the Current Expense Fund, Engineering Department Accounting Division.

Section 5. All expenditures made hereunder shall be paid from any available funds or by the issuance of emergency warrants. If emergency warrants are issued, they shall be paid from any moneys on hand in the City treasury in the Current Expense Fund. If at any time there is insufficient money on hand in said Fund with which to pay any emergency warrant, the warrant shall be registered, bear interest and be called in the same manner as other City warrants. If such emergency expenditures are not paid from available funds during the year in which they are appropriated, the Clerk shall include in the annual budget to be submitted to the City Council the total amount of emergency warrants issued during the preceding fiscal year; and at the time the final budget is adopted the City Council shall include in its tax levies a levy sufficient to reimburse the Fund out of which the emergency warrants were paid or shall budget an item from any revenue source available, for the Fund.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and publication in the manner provided by law.

First introduced on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1959, and passed by the City Council on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1959, and signed in authentication of its passage this 12<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1959.
