CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 3157

AN ORDINANCE relating to political signs,
amending Bellevue City Code (Sign Code)
22B.10.120.E.1.

WHEREAS, it is desirable to simplify the procedure for locating political signs on private property; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bellevue has complied with the State Environmental Policy Act, and with the City's Environmental Procedures Ordinance; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Bellevue City Code (Sign Code) 22B.10.120.E.1 is amended to read as follows:

E. Political Signs on Private Property Not a Headquarters.

1. Signs, posters or bills promoting or publicizing candidates for public office or issues that are to be voted upon in a general or special election may be displayed on private property.

Such signs, posters or bills shall be permitted only for a period of sixty days preceding the election and for a period of seven days following such election; provided, that signs, posters or bills promoting successful candidates in a primary election may remain displayed on private property until seven days following the immediately subsequent general election.


Section 2. This ordinance shall be published by posting it in the




