BELLEVUE CITY ORDINANCE NO. 336

AN ORDINANCE, repealing Ordinance No. 276, No. 283, No. 298 No. 308 and No. 324, and re-establishing job classifications and salaries.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 276, No. 283, No. 298, No. 308 and No. 324 are hereby repealed.

Section 2. The administrative and legislative officers, agents and employees of the City of Bellevue hereinafter listed shall be compensated for services rendered to the City of Bellevue after the 31st day of December, 1959, at the salary, wage or compensation set forth in the following subsections of this section and as shown opposite the respective position classifications, to-wit:




Section 3. In the event that a full time employee or a regular part time employee, as defined by Ordinance No. 238 as amended, is compensated for a period of time which is less than the regular pay period, the rate of compensation will be prorated for that pay period by dividing the actual number of normal working days of the period in question into the pay period rate as fixed by ordinance. "Normal working days" contemplates a five-day work week including legal holidays. "Regular pay periods" are from the 1st to the 15th day, both inclusive, and from the 16th to the last day of the month, both inclusive.

Section 4. An emergency exists, making the immediate passage of this Ordinance necessary for the preservation of public health, safety and general welfare in the City of Bellevue, and the same shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval, and shall fix the compensation for services rendered from and after the 1st day of January, 1960.


