CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 3413

AN ORDINANCE regulating animals, amending Bellevue City Code (Land Use Code) 20.20.130; adding new sections to Bellevue City Code (Land Use Code) 20.50, and repealing Bellevue City Code (Land Use Code) 20.20.500, and 20.20.510.

WHEREAS, it is desirable to regulate the keeping of animals in order to maintain the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the improper keeping of animals in or near residential areas can have adverse impacts on those areas; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bellevue has complied with the State Environmental Policy Act, and with the City's Environmental Procedures Ordinance; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Bellevue City Code (Land Use Code) 20.20.130 is amended to read as follows:

20.20.130 Animals

- A. General: The keeping of animals is subject to the requirements of this Section and Bellevue City Code, Title 8, Animal Regulations. These provisions will be enforced pursuant to the provisions of Section 20.40.430 to 20.40.470.
- B. Minimum Requirements: The following chart entitled, "Animal Regulations" sets forth the minimum requirements for the keeping of animals.

- (A) Number of adult animals. One unweaned litter of offspring, and foals are not included in the number of animals allowed.
 - (B) More than 3 rabbits are regulated as small domestic animals.
 - (C) Requires a conditional use permit.
 - (D) More than six fowl are regulated as small domestic animals.
 - (E) The purpose of these setback requirements is to prohibit the confinement of an animal within specific distances from neighboring property, as by leashing the animal to a stake or placing the animal in an enclosure, but to allow animals to be kept in yards fenced on

their perimeter so long as the animal is free to roam within the fenced area.

C. Prohibited Animals: The keeping of mink, foxes or hogs is prohibited.

Section 2. Bellevue City Code (Land Use Code) 20.20.500 is hereby repealed.

Section 3. Bellevue City Code (Land Use Code) 20.20.510 is hereby repealed.

Section 4. Bellevue City Code (Land Use Code) 20.50.016 is amended by the addition of new definitions which read as follows:

DOMESTIC ANIMALS, LARGE. Generally grazing or foraging animals including horses, cattle, llama, sheep, goats, ponies and other animals of similar size and character.

DOMESTIC ANIMALS, SMALL. Includes ducks, geese, swans, chickens, other fowl and animals of similar size and character, however, fewer than six fowl are treated as household pets.

Section 5. Bellevue City Code (Land Use Code) 20.50.024 is amended by the addition of a new definition which reads as follows:

HOUSEHOLD PETS: Includes dogs, cats, rabbits, gerbels, guinea pigs, hamsters, cage birds, fish, nonvenomous reptiles and amphibians and other animals of similar size and character normally associated with a dwelling unit and generally housed within the dwelling unit. Specifically included as household pets is the keeping of six or fewer fowl.

Section 6. Bellevue City Code (Land Use Code) 20.50.030 is amended to read as follows:

KENNEL: A place where four or more adult dogs or four or more adult cats or any combination thereof are kept, whether by owners of the dogs and cats or by persons providing facilities and care whether or not for compensation, but not including a small animal hospital or clinic or pet shop. An adult dog or cat is one of either sex, altered or unaltered, that has reached the age of four months.

KENNEL, HOBBY: A non-commercial kennel at or adjoining a private residence where four or more adult dogs or four or more adult cats are bred and/or kept for hunting, training, exhibition for organized shows, field, working and/or obedience trials, or for enjoyment of the species. An adult dog or cat is one of either sex, altered or



unaltered, that has reached the age of four months.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five days after its passage and legal publication.




