ORDINANCE NO. 352

AN ORDINANCE relating to the budget; stating the facts constituting an emergency, estimating the amount required to meet the same, and appropriating funds therefor.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There is hereby declared to exist a public emergency which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of the making of the estimates for the annual budget for the year 1960 for the City of Bellevue, and which requires the expenditure of money not provided for in such annual budget and which emergency is not one of those specifically enumerated in Section 32, Chapter 337, Laws of 1955, R.C.W. 35.33.080.

Section 2. The facts found by the City Council to constitute such emergency are: Subsequent to the preparation and enactment of the 1960 budget, (1) a pickup truck used by the Street Department had its transmission go out, and subsequently while operating on a temporary basis, said vehicle had a traffic collision; and (2) a heavy duty truck used by the Street Department developed a defective piston, and in addition thereto had a traffic collision. That it is not economically feasible to attempt to repair said vehicles, and yet said vehicles are urgently needed in the operation of the Street Department.

Section 3. The estimated cost of securing a 3/4 ton truck, cab and bed, in addition to any possible trade-in, is \$2,235.00; and the cost of the 2½ ton truck, chassis with cab (not including bed), is \$3,640.00; a total of \$5,875.00.

Section 4. There is hereby allowed, established and appropriated the sum of \$5,875.00, for use in the securing of said two vehicles, said sum to be appropriated to the Street Department Fund, Capital Outlay Class.

Section 5. All expenditures made hereunder shall be paid from any available funds or by the issuance of emergency warrants. If emergency warrants are issued, they shall be paid from any moneys on hand in the City treasury in the Street Department Fund. If at any time there is insufficient money on hand in said Fund with which to pay any emergency warrant, the warrant shall be registered, bear interest and be called in the same manner as other City warrants. If such emergency expenditures are not paid from available funds during the year in which they are appropriated, the Clerk shall include in the annual budget to be submitted to the City Council the total amount of emergency warrants issued during the preceding fiscal year; and at the time the final budget is adopted the City Council shall include in its tax levies a levy sufficient to reimburse the Fund out of which the emergency warrants were paid or shall budget an item from any revenue source available, for the Fund.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and legal publication.
