ORDINANCE NO. 376

AN ORDINANCE relating to the erection of signs; and amending Section 6 of Ordinance No. 280.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 6 of Ordinance No. 280 passed by the City Council on December 23, 1958, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 6. On public land or in public rights of way permanent or temporary public signs may be permitted, subject to the regulations prescribed by the Bellevue Traffic Code and ordinances of this City. Real estate signs of the sandwich or tripod type which are directional in nature, such as open house signs, may be placed on the shoulders of street rights of way, at least three feet from the traveled portion of the roadway, and during the daylight hours from sunrise to sunset, provided the location does not create a traffic hazard. The signboard size shall not exceed 30" in width or height."

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and legal publication.
