ORDINANCE NO. 496

AN ORDINANCE relating to the use of safety glass in the construction and occupancy of buildings; and amending Chapter 16.12 of the Bellevue City Code.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 16.12 of Bellevue City Code is hereby amended by adding thereto Section 16.12.170 which shall read as follows:

16.12.170 Safety glass required in doors and walls. The glass in sliding doors and glass door assemblies hereafter installed in new, remodeled, or replaced in existing buildings, shall be one of the following:

- 1. Approved laminated safety glass 7/32" or heavier.
- 2. Approved 7/32" or heavier wired glass.
- 3. Approved 7/32" or heavier tempered glass

This section shall include all glass passage doors, and that portion of wall made up of glass starting from a point less than 12" from floor level and extending to the common header height. The provisions of this section shall not apply to multi-glass panel doors or french doors.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and legal publication.
