

ORDINANCE NO. 53

AN ORDINANCE declaring a public emergency; estimating the amount necessary to meet the same and appropriating funds therefor.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There hereby is declared to exist a public emergency, which could not have been reasonably foreseen at the time of making estimates for the annual budget, and which requires the expenditure of money not provided for in the annual budget for the year 1954, and which emergency is not one of those specifically mentioned in Chap. 158, Sec. 6, Laws of 1923.

Section 2. Such emergency consists of the imminence of the improvement and development of Lot 17 or 18, Belway Plat, as residential property, which lot is essential to the extension and development of N.E. 12th Street as a city thoroughfare.

Section 3. The estimated cost of acquiring the necessary portion of Lot 17 or 18 in Belway Plat is One Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$ 1,600.00).

Section 4. There hereby is appropriated the sum of One Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$1,600.00), to be available for acquisitions of such portions of Lots 17 or 18, Belway Plat as are necessary for extension of N.E. 12th Street.

Section 5. The Clerk shall include in the annual budget for the year 1955 the total amount of emergency warrants issued hereunder and reimburse the fund or funds out of which the emergency warrants were paid.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five days after its passage, approval and publication.
