

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 5429

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute, on behalf of the City as Administrator of the Washington City and County Pipeline Safety Consortium, an agreement (and supplements, if necessary) with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (WUTC) for \$95,076 in Federal Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund monies to advance the work of the Consortium; establishing a project within the Operating Grants and Donations Fund; amending the budget for the Operating Grants and Donations fund by appropriating additional revenues to that fund; authorizing expenditures of said grant funds; and authorizing interfund loans.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 6429, adopted June 5, 2000, the City entered into an Interlocal Agreement establishing the Washington City and County Pipeline Safety Consortium; and

WHEREAS, said Agreement provides that the City of Bellevue shall be the Administrator of the Agreement, and is authorized to enter into agreements with other federal, state and local agencies to receive grants and funds on behalf of the Consortium, upon authorization of the Executive Board of the Consortium; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Board has authorized the City to enter into an Agreement with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (WUTC) for \$95,076 in Federal Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund monies to advance the work of the Consortium; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute, on behalf of the City as Administrator of the Washington City and County Pipeline Safety Consortium, an Agreement (and supplements, if necessary) with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (WUTC) for \$95,076 in Federal Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund monies to advance the work of the Consortium, a copy of which Agreement has been given Clerk's Receiving No. _____.

Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive monies and to expend the same as authorized in said Agreement.

Section 3. At the time of execution of said Agreement and acceptance of said funds, a project shall be established within the Operating Grants and Donations Fund into which all said monies shall be deposited.

Section 4. The City Manager or his designated representative shall have responsibility for the administration of said grant monies and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 5. The approximate amount and source of revenue for the grant proposal and acceptance are:

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Section 6. Upon execution of said Agreement the budget for the Operating Grants and Donations Fund shall be amended by appropriating to that fund additional revenues in the amount of the grant proposal and acceptance herein authorized.

Provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the source specified in said grant agreement should be more or less than the amount set forth herein, the appropriations shall be adjusted to equal the amount actually received.

Section 7. The Finance Director or his designee is authorized to make interfund loans from an appropriate City fund to the Operating Grants and Donations Fund in whatever amounts, for whatever duration or under whatever terms are appropriate and necessary to cover cash flow shortages in the Operating Grants and Donations fund that may be created by this grant.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five days after its passage and legal publication.
