AN ORDINANCE relating to signs; and amending Chapter 17.04 of the Bellevue City Code.


THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 17.04.031 of the Bellevue City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:


17.04.031 Directional Signs. Institutions such as churches, schools, hospitals, or business establishments removed and isolated from the principal traffic routes, or identifiable communities or neighborhoods, may erect one or two public signs for directional purposes. Such signs shall be located on the outside edge of a public street right-of-way and outside of the sight obstruction triangle at intersections (85' on each centerline) and parallel to the right-of-way line. Each such sign shall be lettered on an unpainted 1" x 8" S4S cedar board 42" long, pointed at one end and hung from an unpainted cedar 4" x 6" post and 2" x 6" crossarm support, 5' high. Multiple signs at one intersection shall be hung one under the other. The City Engineering Department shall define the detail of sign and post support design and shall control the number and location of such public sign installations. In general, such signs should be grouped at principal intersections where the maximum public benefit will be served.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and legal publication.
