CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 5588

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute a Crossroads Area Transit Program (CATP) agreement (and supplements if necessary) with King County; amending the 2005-2006 General Capital Investment Program (CIP) Fund appropriation to increase by \$11,100; and amending the 2005-2011 CIP Plan to increase the Transportation Demand Management project budget for CIP Plan No. PW-R-87 by \$11,100 to reflect grant revenue received from King County for the Carless in Bellevue Bus Guide.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute a Crossroads Area Transit Program (CATP) agreement (and supplements if necessary) with King County for an estimated total city expenditure of \$24,450 and for the acceptance of grant revenue in an estimated amount of \$11,100 as follows:

- a. payment to King County of \$9,650 for the Residential Transportation Coordinator (RTC) program;
- b. expenditure of \$14,800 for the Carless in Bellevue Bus Guide;
- c. receipt of up to \$11,100 in grant revenue from King County provided by the Federal Transit Administration Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) grant for the Carless in Bellevue Bus Guide for a net City expenditure for the Bus Guide program of \$3,700 in City matching grant funds.

A copy of said agreement is hereby given Clerk's Receiving No. 37265

Section 2. The City's 2005-2006 General Capital Investment Program (CIP) Fund appropriation adopted by Ordinance No. 5580 on December 6, 2004, as previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase the appropriation to said CIP Fund by \$11,100.

Section 3. The City's 2005-2011 General CIP Plan adopted by Ordinance No. 5580 on December 6, 2004 as previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase the Transportation Demand Management project budget CIP Plan No. PW-R-87 by \$11,100.

Section 4. The City Manager or his designee shall have the responsibility for the administration of said grant monies and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 5. The approximate amount and source of revenue for the grant proposal and acceptance are:

Provided however, if the actual revenues received from the source specified in said agreement should be more or less than the amount set forth herein, the appropriations shall be adjusted to equal the amount actually received.

Section 6. The Finance Director or his designee is authorized to make interfund loans from an appropriate City fund to the CIP Fund in whatever amounts, for whatever duration or under whatever terms are appropriate and necessary to cover cash flow shortages in said funds that may be created by this grant.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after passage and legal publication.


