

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 5648

AN ORDINANCE authorizing 1) the execution of two grant agreements (and supplements if necessary) with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) for the acceptance of Federal Highway Administration Discretionary Funds; 2) amending the 2005-2006 General Capital Investment Program (CIP) fund to increase the appropriation by \$9,153,553; and, 3) amending the 2005-2011 CIP by increasing the project budget for the NE 10th Street Extension project (CIP Plan No. PW-R-149).

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute two grant agreements (and supplements if necessary) with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to accept in total \$9,153,553 in Federal Highway Administration Discretionary Funds (grant awards of \$7,870,345 and \$1,283,208 respectively) awarded through the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) program. A copy of said agreements respectively are hereby given Clerk's Receiving Nos. 41553 and 41554.

Section 2. The City's 2005-2006 General Capital Investment Program (CIP) Fund appropriation adopted by Ordinance No. 5580 on December 6, 2004, as previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase the appropriation to said CIP Fund by \$9,153,553.

Section 3. The City's 2005-2011 General CIP Plan adopted by Ordinance No. 5580 on December 6 2004 as previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase the project budget for CIP Plan No. PW-R-149 for the NE 10th Street Extension project by \$9,153,553 in SAFETEA-LU funds.

Section 4. The City Manager or his designee shall have the responsibility for the administration of said grant monies and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 5. The approximate amount and source of revenue for the grant proposal and acceptance are:


Provided, however, if the actual revenues received from the source specified in said agreement should be more or less than the amount set forth herein, the appropriations shall be adjusted to equal the amount actually received.

Section 6. The Finance Director or her designee is authorized to make interfund loans from an appropriate City fund to the CIP Fund in whatever amounts, for whatever duration or under whatever terms are appropriate and necessary to cover cash flow shortages in said funds that may be created by this grant.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after passage and legal publication.




