

## CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 614

ORIGINAL

AN ORDINANCE establishing the grade of the centerline of N.E. 10th Street, from 100th Avenue N.E. to 102nd Avenue N.E.


THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Upon due investigation and deliberation the City Council has determined that N.E. 10th Street between 100th Avenue N.E. and 102nd Avenue N.E., as located by the records of the City Manager, has never been opened by public user on the natural contours of the land, and no definite official grade thereof has been established either by the legislative action of any public body having jurisdiction thereof, nor by the grading or other authorized act of such public body, and the safety of the public, the location and installation of public utility lines and drainage ditches or sewers require the establishment of an official and permanent grade of the centerline thereof.

Section 2. The City Council of the City of Bellevue has approved the recommendations and drawings of the City Manager relating thereto as depicted and described on drawing No. 1, dated August, 1963, of Project No. 63-S-50, on file in the office of the City Engineer, received under Clerk's Receiving No. 676 fixing the centerline grade of N.E. 10th Street, from 100th Avenue N.E. to 102nd Avenue N.E.; and the City Council of the City of Bellevue does hereby declare and establish the grade of the centerline of said street in accordance with the said drawings, scales and specifications as depicted and described therein.


Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and legal publication.

PASSED by the City Council on this 1st day of October, 1963, and signed in authentication of its passage this 1st day of October, 1963.


