

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 6756

AN ORDINANCE 1) authorizing execution of a two-year Interlocal Agreement (and supplements if necessary) with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to accept up to \$478,200 of state funds to support the City's Commute Trip Reduction (CTR) Program; and, 2) amending the 2023-2024 Operating Grants, Donations and Special Reserves Fund to increase the appropriation by \$358,650.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON,
DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or designee is authorized to execute a two-year Interlocal Agreement (and supplements if necessary) with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to accept up to \$478,200 of state funds to support the City's Commute Trip Reduction (CTR) Program, a copy of which Interlocal Agreement shall be substantially in the form given Clerk's Receiving No. 81174.

Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive monies and to expend the same as authorized in said Interlocal Agreement and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 3. At the time of execution of said Interlocal Agreement and acceptance of said funds, a project shall be established within the Operating Grants, Donations and Special Reserves Fund into which said respective Interlocal Agreement monies shall be deposited.

Section 4. The approximate amount and anticipated source of revenue for said Interlocal Agreement monies is:

Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) \$478,200

Section 5. Ordinance No. 6698, adopted on November 21, 2022, and previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase the 2023-2024 budget, by increasing appropriations to the Operating Grants, Donations and Special Reserves Fund by \$358,650 in anticipated grant funds to be received from the Washington State Department of Commerce in 2023-2024.

Provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the anticipated source specified in said Interlocal Agreement shall be more or less than the anticipated amount

set forth herein, the appropriations shall be adjusted to be equal to the amount actually received.

Section 6. Severability. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage and legal publication.
