ORDINANCE NO. <u>6766</u>

AN ORDINANCE (1) authorizing execution of a sub-grant agreement with King County to accept \$387,500 in reimbursable grant funding to support the Energy Smart Eastside Heat Pump Program; (2) amending the 2023-2024 General Capital Investment Program (CIP) Fund to increase the appropriation by \$387,500; and (3) amending the 2023-2029 CIP Plan to increase the budget for the Environmental Stewardship Initiative (ESI) Plan Implementation (CIP Plan No. CD-46) by \$387,500.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager, or her designee, is authorized to execute a subgrant agreement with King County to accept \$387,500 in reimbursable grant funding to support the Energy Smart Eastside Heat Pump Program, a copy of which sub-grant agreement shall be substantially in the form given Clerk's Receiving No. ______

Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive and expend monies as permitted in the sub-grant agreement.

Section 3. The City Manager, or her designee, shall have responsibility for the administration of the grant funds and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof, including agreements to expend funds as provided in the sub-grant agreement.

Section 4. The amount and source of revenue for the grant acceptance is:

\$387,500

King County

King County is the source of the revenue pursuant to a contract (No. S21-92404-001) between the Washington State Department of Commerce and Washington State University and a subcontract (No. 141811 SPC004886) between Washington State University and King County.

Section 5. Upon execution of the sub-grant agreement, the 2023-2024 General Capital Investment Program (CIP) Fund, adopted by Ordinance No. 6764 on November 20, 2023, and previously amended, is hereby further amended by appropriating \$387,500 to said fund. Provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the anticipated source specified in the sub-grant agreement shall be more or less than the

anticipated amount set forth herein, the appropriation shall be adjusted to be equal to the amount actually received.

Section 6. Upon execution of the sub-grant agreement, the 2023-2029 CIP Plan, adopted by Ordinance No. 6764 on November 20, 2023, and previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase the budget for the Environmental Stewardship Initiative (ESI) Plan Implementation (CIP Plan No. CD-46) by \$387,500. Provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the anticipated source specified in the subgrant agreement shall be more or less than the anticipated amount set forth herein, the appropriations shall be adjusted to be equal to the amount actually received.

Section 7. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage and legal publication.
