

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 6774

AN ORDINANCE 1) authorizing execution of a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to accept up to \$2,500,000 in federal Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grant funding to support construction of the Eastrail-Mountains to Sound Greenway Regional Trails Connection as part of the larger Eastrail Project (CIP Plan No. G-103); and, 2) amending the 2023-2029 General Capital Investment Program (CIP) Plan to decrease the budget for the Transportation Grant Match Program (CIP Plan No. PW-R-206) by \$781,200 and increase the budget for the Eastrail Project (CIP Plan No. G-103) by \$3,281,200.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or designee is authorized to execute a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to accept grant funds up to \$2,500,000 in federal Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grant funding to support construction of the Eastrail-Mountains to Sound Greenway Regional Trails Connection as part of the larger Eastrail Project (CIP Plan No. G-103), a copy of which grant agreement shall be substantially in the form given Clerk's Receiving No. _____.

Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive and expend monies as permitted in the grant agreement.

Section 3. The City Manager, or designee, shall have responsibility for the administration of the grant funds and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 4. The 2023-2029 General Capital Investment Program (CIP) Plan adopted by Ordinance No. 6698 on November 21, 2022, as previously amended, is hereby further amended to decrease the budget for the Transportation Grant Match Program (CIP Plan No. PW-R-206) by \$781,200 and increase the budget for the Eastrail Project (CIP Plan No. G-103) by \$3,281,200.


Section 5. If the actual revenue received shall be more or less than the anticipated amount set forth herein, the appropriation to the CIP Plan shall be adjusted to be equal to the amount actually received.

Section 6. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage and legal publication.
