WHEREAS a petition has been filed by the City in the Superior Court of the State of Washington for King County "--to acquire by condemnation certain property and property rights for 106th Avenue N.E., between Main Street and N.E. 8th Street, as contemplated in Ordinance No. 359"; that said matter was assigned docket number 554106; that on January 19, 1961, the court indicated that it would award judgment to the following individuals in the amount shown:

AND WHEREAS it is necessary to issue L.I.D. warrants in payment thereof; and

WHEREAS R.C.W. 8.12.210 provides that upon payment by the City into the registry of the Court of the condemnation award that the Court shall enter an Order which shall immediately vest title in the City ; and

WHEREAS it is desired by all parties to complete the condemnation proceedings quickly so that steps looking forward to the actual construction may proceed; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Bellevue, Washington, as follows:


Section 1. That certain Deed of Dedication, to-wit:

Section 2. The administration is hereby authorized to record said Deed of Dedication with the King County Auditor, and to file certified copies of same with the King County Assessor.





to U.S. Highway No. 10.



WHEREAS the estimated cash balance in the Interest and Debt Redemption Fund, to meet the above enumerated maturities will amount to \$2,801.50; and

WHEREAS the 1960 tax levies, for collection in the year 1961, for the redemption of maturing interest and principal on general obligation bonds will not be received in adequate amounts until approximately June, 1961; and


WHEREAS it is apparent that it is necessary, in order to meet maturing principal and interest on such bonded indebtedness, to borrow from some solvent fund of the City; and

WHEREAS the 1959 G.O. Bonds - Street Improvement Fund is solvent with a balance of \$20,429.21, as of February 23, 1961, and no large payments from this fund are anticipated prior to June, 1961; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the administrative personnel be, and they are hereby authorized, to transfer from the 1959 G.O. Bonds - Street Improvement Fund to the G.O. Bonds Interest and Debt Redemption Fund the sum of \$16,000.00, as a temporary loan to be repaid within the calendar year of 1961 without interest.

A RESOLUTION designating official depositories for funds of the City of Bellevue.

WHEREAS the laws of the State of Washington require that municipalities annually designate depositories for the keeping of municipal funds; and

WHEREAS the Seattle-First National Bank, Bellevue Branch, and the Pacific National Bank of Seattle, Bellevue Branch, and the National Bank of Commerce, Bellevue Branch, are all banking corporations authorized to do business in the City of Bellevue, King County, State of Washington; now, therefore,


THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Seattle-First National Bank, Bellevue Branch, and the Pacific National Bank of Seattle, Bellevue Branch, and the National Bank of Commerce, Bellevue Branch, be and each is hereby selected and declared as an official depository for the funds of the City of Bellevue, and that such funds may be withdrawn upon warrants and checks payable to the order of one or more persons.

Section 2. All warrants shall bear two signatures, being those of the City Manager (or Acting City Manager) and the City Clerk (or Deputy City Clerk). All checks will bear the signature of the City Treasurer (or Acting City Treasurer). Endorsements for deposits may be made by rubber stamp and shall bind the City to the same effect as though signed by the proper authorized official.

Section 3. The above-named depositories shall each comply with the State law in regard to the placing of minimum security deposits to cover all municipal funds.



RESOLUTION NO. 850

A RESOLUTION consenting to the establishment within the City of limited access to the east approach to the Evergreen Point Bridge.

WHEREAS a proposed plan has been prepared in accordance with the instructions of the Washington State Highway Commission for a portion of the East Approach to Evergreen Point Bridge: 92nd Ave. N.E. to Bellevue Corp. Limits; and

WHEREAS a portion of the proposed highway improvement lies within the City of Bellevue; and

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 235, Session Laws of 1957, the proposed plan was presented at a public hearing held in the City of Bellevue on January 4, 1961 for an expression on the desirability of the plan; and

WHEREAS certain modifications submitted at the public hearing are deemed desirable, the plan has been modified in the following respects in accordance with the evidence presented at the public hearing:

The addition of a frontage service road between Highway Engineer's Station 277+00 and 304+00 on the left; and

WHEREAS time is of the essence for the acquisition of rights of way and subsequent construction of the highway of which this is a part; now therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:


That in accordance with the provisions of R.C.W. 47.52.020 et seq., that the City of Bellevue, acting through its officers and authorities, does hereby consent to the establishment of limited access on the following described portion of the East Approach to Evergreen Point Bridge within the corporate limits of the City of Bellevue:

Between Highway Engineer's Station 286+75 and Highway Engineer's Station 316+40 except those portions within the city limits of Houghton or King County, in accordance with the plan entitled "East Approach to Evergreen Point Bridge: 92nd Ave. N.E. to Bellevue Corp. Limits," sheets 1 and 2 of 4 sheets approved by the Director of Highways on February 7, 1961, a print of which plan is hereto attached and made a part of this resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution shall be transmitted to the Washington State Highway Commission at Olympia, Washington.


