



A RESOLUTION regarding the annexation
of contiguous unincorporated territory.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES
RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council does hereby determine that the best interests and general welfare of the City of Bellevue would be served by the annexation of the following-described unincorporated territory which is contiguous to the City of Bellevue:

Beginning from the Intersection of the Centerline of Redmond-Bellevue
Road #1387 and the east line of Section 28, Township 25 N, Range
5 E, W. M., King County, Washington; thence northerly along said east
line to its intersection with the centerline of Northrup Way; thence
northwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the
north-south center-section line of said Section 28; thence northerly
along said center-section line to the north line of said Section 28;
thence easterly along said north line to its intersection with the
center-line of 130th Ave. NE; thence northerly along said centerline
to its intersection with the east-west center section line of Section
21; thence westerly along the said east-west center section line to the
west line of the east $\frac{1}{2}$ of the west $\frac{1}{2}$ of the north-east $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 21;
thence northerly along said west line to the north line of said Section 21;
thence easterly along said north line and along the north lines of
Sections 22 and 23 to the north-east corner of said Section 23; thence
southerly along the east line of said Section 23 to the SE corner of said
Section 23; thence westerly along the south line of said Section 23 to
its intersection with the centerline of NE Redmond-Bellevue Road #1387;
thence south-westerly along the centerline of said Redmond-Bellevue
Road to the Point of Beginning.

Section 2. That, as nearly as may be, the number of voters residing in the aforesaid territory is 2500.


Section 3. The City Council does hereby pray that the Board of County Commissioners of King County, Washington, call an election to be held among the qualified voters in the aforesaid territory upon the question of annexation.

Section 4. That the cost of said annexation election shall be paid by the City of Bellevue.

Section 5. That there also be submitted to the electorate of the aforesaid territory a proposition that all property within the area annexed shall, upon annexation, be assessed and taxed at the same rate and on the same basis as the property of the City of Bellevue is assessed and taxed to pay for any then outstanding indebtedness of the City of Bellevue, contracted prior to, or existing at, the date of annexation.

Section 6. That a certified copy of this resolution be filed with the Board of County Commissioners of King County, Washington, in which county said territory is located.

A RESOLUTION declaring the intention to order a local improvement for the location, establishment and construction of streets; to-wit portions of N.E. 6th Street and 110th Avenue N.E.; setting forth the nature and extent thereof, setting a date for hearing objections thereto, and giving notice thereof.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON:

Section 1. That it is the intention of the City Council to order the improvement of an area within the City comprised of the following-described continuous units of the improvement:

UNIT A (N.E. 6th St., from 104th Ave. N.E. to 108th Ave. N.E.)

Beginning at the intersection of the centerline of 104th Avenue NE and the westerly extension of the east-west centerline of Lot 1, Block 2, Cheriton Fruit Gardens Plat No. 1 as recorded in Volume 7, Page 47, of Plats records of King County. Thence easterly along the westerly extension of said centerline and along the centerline of Lots 1 and 2 of said Block 2 and along the easterly extension of said centerline to an intersection with the centerline of 108th Avenue NE; thence southerly along the centerline of 108th Avenue NE to the intersection of the easterly extension of the east-west centerline of Lot 3 of said Block 2; thence westerly along the easterly extension of said centerline and the east-west centerline of Lots 3 and 4 of said Block 2, and the westerly extension of said centerline to an intersection with the centerline of 104th Avenue NE; thence northerly along said centerline of 104th Avenue NE to the point of beginning, all in Section 32, Township 25 North, Range 5 East, W.M., City of Bellevue, King County, Washington.

UNIT B (N.E. 6th St., from 108th Ave. N.E. to 112th Ave. N.E.; plus 110th Avenue N.E. from N.E. 6th St., to a point 215 feet south of the centerline of N.E. 8th St.)

Beginning at the SW corner of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 32, Township 25, North, Range 5 East, W.M.; which point is the intersection of the centerline of 108th Avenue NE and the proposed centerline of NE 6th Street. Thence northerly along the centerline of 108th Avenue NE to the SW corner of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 32; thence easterly along the south line of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 32, to the intersection with the west line of the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 32; thence northerly along said west line to a line 215' south of and parallel with the centerline of NE 8th Street, thence easterly along said line to the intersection with the east line of the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 32; thence southerly along said east line to the intersection with the south line of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 32; thence easterly along said south line to the intersection with the SE corner of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 32; said point being on the proposed centerline of 112th Avenue NE; thence southerly along said centerline to the SE corner of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section; thence westerly along the south line of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ to the SW corner of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 32, said point being on the centerline of 108th Avenue NE; thence northerly along the centerline of 108th Avenue NE to the point of beginning; situated within the corporate city limits of the City of Bellevue, King County, Washington.

Section 2. That the area described in Section 1 hereof shall be improved by the construction and installation of N.E. 6th Street, from 104th Avenue N.E. to 108th Avenue N.E., (hereinafter called "Unit A",) plus N.E. 6th Street, from 108th Avenue N.E. to 112th Avenue N.E., plus 110th Avenue N.E. from N.E. 6th Street to a point 215 feet south of the centerline of N.E. 8th Street, (hereinafter called "Unit B",) by paving the same with asphalt cement concrete (commonly referred to as "Plant mix"), including the securing of necessary easements and rights-of-way, and including grading, re-grading, filling, compacting, ballasting, surfacing and draining, and the installation of drain inlets, storm sewers, cross walks, and other appurtenances consistent with good street construction. The right-of-way in Unit A shall be 50 feet in width, with the exception of the westerly 109.5 feet thereof measured from the centerline of 104th Avenue N.E., which shall be 45 feet in width, to-wit from ^{15 feet} ~~25~~ feet north of the centerline to ^{30 feet} ~~25~~ feet south of the centerline of N.E. 6th Street; and with the exception of the easterly 81.91 feet thereof measured from the centerline of 108th Avenue N.E., which shall be 45 feet in width, to-wit from 25 feet north of the centerline to 20 feet south of the centerline of N.E. 6th Street. The traveled way in Unit A shall be 40 feet wide. The right-of-way in Unit B shall be 60 feet in width, and the traveled way shall be 40 feet wide. All the foregoing shall be in accordance with plans and specifications to be submitted by the City Engineer.

Section 3. All of the cost and expense in connection with the installation and construction of said improvement, including the estimated cost and expense of: (a) The improvement within street intersections. (b) All engineering and surveying necessary for the improvement, whether done under the supervision of the City Engineer or otherwise. (c) All legal work and opinions incidental thereto. (d) Ascertaining the ownership of lots or parcels of land included within the assessment districts. (e) Appraisals. (f) Advertising, mailing, posting and publishing all necessary notices. (g) Accounting, clerical labor and of books and blanks, extended or used on the part of the City Clerk or Treasurer in connection with the improvement. (h) Acquisition of rights-of-way, property, easement and other facilities or rights-of-way, and all other expenses incidental thereto as required or provided by law of the State of Washington and ordinances of the City of Bellevue shall be allocated to and borne by the properties within the improvement district, in accordance with the special benefits conferred, and the costs assessed against the individual lots in accordance with the statutory zone and termini method. Those costs mentioned above which are incurred for the benefit of one particular unit, shall be charged to that unit only. Those costs mentioned above, which are incurred for the benefit of the entire improvement shall be pro-rated to the separate continuous units according to the following formulae: The portion of the expense involved to be charged to a continuous unit shall be to the entire expense, as the total cost of the continuous unit bears to the total cost of the two (2) continuous units. The right-of-way in each separate Unit shall either (1) be all donated to the City of Bellevue for street purposes by the property owners, at no cost whatsoever to the City and L.I.D., or (2) be all condemned by the City of Bellevue, with the cost thereof charged to that particular Unit of the said L.I.D. The improvement shall be paid for under the mode of "Payment by Bonds," by means of assessments against the various properties as aforesaid, all as provided by statute and ordinance for local improvement districts.

That all persons who may desire to object thereto are hereby notified to appear and present such objections at a meeting of the City Council, or a committee thereof, to be held in the City Hall, 835 - 106th Avenue N.E., Bellevue, Washington, at 8:30 o'clock P.M., on the 9th day of January, 1962, which time and place is hereby fixed for hearing all matters relating to said proposed improvement, and all objections thereto, and for determining the method of payment for said improvement.

Section 5. That the City Manager shall submit to the City Council at or prior to said date, all data and information required by law to be submitted.

A RESOLUTION declaring the intention to order a local improvement for the location, establishment and construction of a portion of 98th Avenue N.E.; setting forth the nature and extent thereof; setting a date for hearing objections thereto, and giving notice thereof.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON:

Section 1. That it is the intention of the City Council to order the improvement of an area within the City comprised of the following-described continuous unit of the improvement:

Beginning from the intersection of the centerlines of N.E. 18th Street and 98th Ave. NE in Section 30, Twsp. 25 N, R 5 E, W. M., thence northerly along the centerline of said NE 98th Ave. to the centerline of NE 24th St., thence easterly along the centerline of said NE 24th Street to a point midway between the centerlines of said 98th Ave. NE and 100th Ave. NE, thence southerly in a straight line, midway between the said centerlines to the centerline of NE 18th Street, thence westerly along the centerline of said NE 18th Street to the point of Beginning.

Section 2. That the area described in Section 1 hereof shall be improved by the construction and installation of the easterly portion of 98th Avenue N.E., from N.E. 18th Street to N.E. 24th Street, by paving the same with asphalt cement concrete (commonly referred to as "plant mix"), including the securing of necessary easements and rights-of-way, and including grading, re-grading, filling, compacting, ballasting, surfacing and draining, and the installation of Inlets and Six-inch storm sewer connectors and other appurtenances consistent with good street construction. The right-of-way shall be 30 feet wide, and the traveled way shall be 8 feet wide, both measured easterly from the centerline of said street, which is the city limits of the City of Bellevue. All of the foregoing shall be in accordance with plans and specifications to be submitted by the City Engineer.

Section 3. All of the cost and expense in connection with the installation and construction of said improvement, including the estimated cost and expense of (a) The improvement within street intersections. (b) All engineering and surveying necessary for the improvement, whether done under the supervision of the City Engineer or otherwise. (c) All legal work and opinions incidental thereto. (d) Ascertaining the ownership of lots or parcels of land included within the assessment districts. (e) Appraisals. (f) Advertising, mailing, posting and publishing all necessary notices. (g) Accounting, clerical labor and of books and blanks, extended or used on the part of the City Clerk or Treasurer in connection with the improvement. (h) Acquisition of rights-of-way, property, easement, and other facilities or rights-of-way and all other expenses incidental thereto as required or provided by law of the State of Washington and ordinances of the City of Bellevue shall be allocated to and borne by the properties within the improvement district, in accordance with the special benefits conferred, and the costs assessed against the individual lots in accordance with the statutory zone and termini method. Provided However, that the City shall pay 50% of the cost of the said Local Improvement District exclusive of land acquisition, which portion of the cost shall be paid from the proceeds of the sale of Street Improvement Bonds, sale of which was heretofore authorized by Ordinance No. 431 passed by the City Council on February 14, 1961.

Section 4. The improvement shall be paid for under the mode of "Payment by Bonds," by means of assessments against the various properties as aforesaid, all as provided by statute and ordinance for local improvement districts.

WHEREAS a hearing was held at 8:30 o'clock p.m. on December 12, 1961, as to the advisability of adopting the proposed comprehensive street program for the ensuing six years; now therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City of Bellevue Six Year Street Improvement Plan, in the total sum of \$1,671,230.00, and received under Clerk's Receiving number 504, is hereby adopted.

Section 2. That a certified copy of this Resolution shall be filed with the Director of Highways not more than thirty (30) days after the adoption hereof.

Section 3. That biennially hereafter the Council shall review the work accomplished under said Six Year Street Improvement Plan and determine the City's current street needs; and based on those findings, shall prepare and after public hearings thereon adopt a revised and extended comprehensive street program.

RESOLUTION NO. 888

A RESOLUTION relating to the 1961 budget; decreasing certain unexpended items, and making transfers between items and classes within funds.

WHEREAS Chapter 166, Laws of 1961, provides that "Transfers between the general classes--shall be permitted when authorized by resolution duly adopted by the majority vote of all members of the legislative body of any city--" and "--the budgetary transfers herein authorized may be made as between any offices, departments--or any combination thereof--which operate from the appropriations of the same fund;" Now therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council does hereby find that those monies heretofore appropriated in Ordinance No. 413, as amended, for the several classes, accounting divisions and items listed below are not required for the City's operation in 1961 to the extent by which said classes, accounting divisions and items are decreased in Section 4 below; and that the classes, accounting divisions and items listed in Section 5 below require more monies for expenditure in 1961 than had been anticipated or were available in making appropriations in Ordinance No. 413, as amended; and that it is to the best interests of the City to transfer monies appropriated in Ordinance No. 413, as amended, so that the monies so transferred and reappropriated herein can be more advantageously expended in the rendition of municipal services in the year 1961.

Section 2. No portion of the funds so transferred shall be used to increase the salary of any employee above that provided for in the 1961 budget, as amended, and such transfer and reappropriation of funds herein will not constitute an increase or decrease of the entire budget of expenditures estimated and appropriated for the year 1961 by Ordinance No. 413, as amended.

Section 3. Ordinance No. 413, passed by the City Council of the City of Bellevue on the 3rd day of October, 1960, as amended, classifying and itemizing the estimated expenditures of municipal funds for the year 1961, is hereby amended to the extent by which items are decreased in Section 4 hereof, and to the extent that transfers of monies are made between classes, accounting divisions and items of expenditures as contained in Section 5 hereof.

Section 4. Subject to the existence of unexpended monies in each of the below listed items, the appropriation for such items as contained in Ordinance No. 413, as amended, is recalled, revoked and decreased to the following extent:
