RESOLUTION NO. 939

A RESOLUTION regarding land outside of the City of Bellevue and northeasterly thereof and commonly referred to as the Bridle Trails area; regarding the zoning of such land should it ever become a part of the City, and declaring the intention of the Council thereto.

WHEREAS the Planning Commission has considered the subject of the most appropriate zoning for land outside the City and northeasterly thereof; and has made recommendations to the Council in the form of a map indicating the zoning which the Planning Commission considers most appropriate for such area in the event it should ever become a part of the City; and

WHEREAS the Council has considered the matter and desires to express its intention as to the zoning which it feels would be most appropriate for the area involved; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council does hereby declare that it concurs with the Planning Commission, and does hereby declare that the zoning indicated on that certain map, received under Clerk's Receiving Number 603, is the most appropriate zoning for the land involved, should such land ever become a part of the City of Bellevue.
